

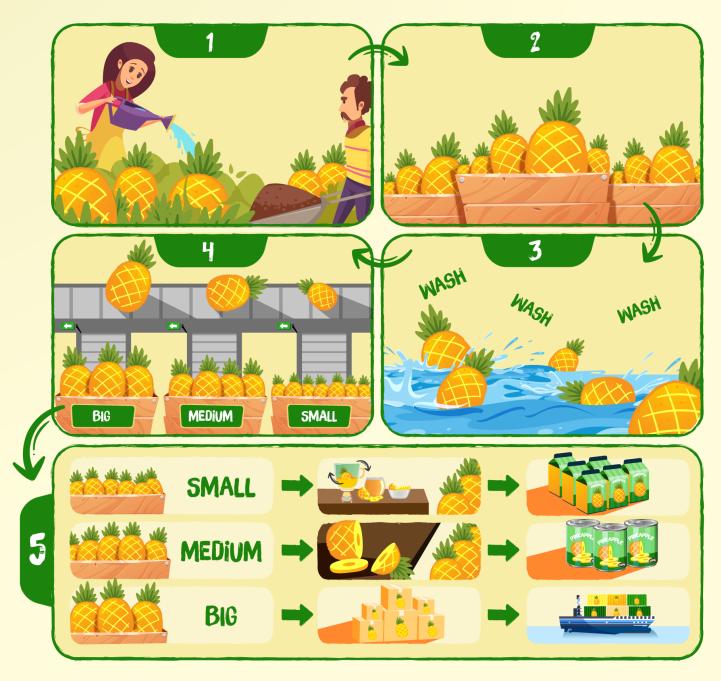

Idea cho overview

Dạng Process chưa từng xuất hiện trong IELTS Insights vì chúng mình thấy xác suất gặp thấp. Tuy nhiên, do có quá nhiều bạn yêu cầu bàn luận về bài **Process trái dứa** này, nên chúng mình sẽ cùng tìm hiểu trong số tháng này nha.

Vấn đề của dạng Process là chúng mình rất dễ... bỏ qua các tiểu tiết trong bài (ví dụ trái dứa được xử lý bằng 3 cách **tuỳ theo kích cỡ**, người ta vẽ 3 kích cỡ khác nhau là có chủ ý nhé mọi người). Tất cả các chi tiết trong hình chúng mình đều phải đề câp, nếu không sẽ bi mất điểm.

Trong phần overview, chúng mình không nhất thiết phải nêu chính xác số bước (12, 13, 14 bước), lý do rõ ràng là với bài này gần như không thể có kết luận chính xác là bao nhiêu bước (mình nói là có...nhiều bước, là được).

Overview bài này chúng mình nên tách ra thành **2 phần** tương ứng như đề:

=> Quy trình diễn ra trong nhiều bước, có 2 phần tách biệt là trồng trọt - diễn ra trong 1 năm, và sau đó là chế biến theo 3 cách thành juice, canned fruit và export.

=> Ngôn ngữ để viết Overview dạng Process rất đặc trưng, bài nào mình cũng viết như vậy, nên mọi người cố nhớ những cụm này nhé.

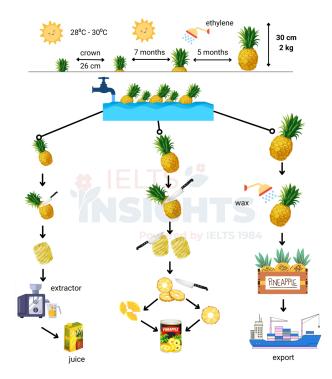

Cách phân 2 body

Thông thường mình sẽ phân body ra **làm đôi**, **body 1** sẽ là một nửa đầu các step trong bài, **body 2** sẽ là nửa sau.

Tuy nhiên, với bài này thì mình thấy có 2 giai đoạn rất tách biệt là **trồng** và **chế biến** => vậy nên mình sẽ viết **mỗi khâu là một body** nhé mọi người (dù khâu chế biến có nhiều bước hơn hẳn khâu trồng).

3 Cách lần lượt tả từng câu

Mọi người đọc kĩ đề và có thể in cuốn Journal này ra, và lấy bút khoanh lại những chỗ cần phải đưa thông tin nhé. Dạng Process gần như thuần tuý là văn miêu tả, không có gì đặc biệt cả. Chúng mình chỉ cần cố gắng tả đủ thông tin theo thứ tự, là ổn nhé mọi người.

Body 1: (Câu 1) Tả cây dứa được trồng bằng leftover crowns, và trồng cách nhau 26 cm => (Câu 2) Cần trời nắng (mình để ý cái hình mặt trời nhen), và nhiệt độ tối ưu là 28 đến 30 độ C => (Câu 3) Sau 7 tháng thì được phun ethylene, và sau đó thêm 5 tháng nữa thì trưởng thành, cao 30cm và nặng 2kg.

Body 2: (Câu 1) Trái dứa được đem đi rửa, trước khi trải qua 3 giai đoạn chế biến, tuỳ thuộc vào kích cỡ của trái (thông tin này rất quan trọng). => (Câu 2) Trái nhỏ nhất, mình sẽ gọt vỏ và phần crown bằng dao, sau đó dùng extractor để lấy nước ép => (Câu 3) Trái cỡ vừa, đi qua các bước sơ chế tương tự, hoặc đó được cắt hoặc cắt khúc (slice or dice), sau đó đi đóng hộp => (Câu 4) Trái lớn nhất, được phủ wax rồi đóng vô kiện hàng (crate), rồi giao đi cho khách bằng tàu container (cargo ship)

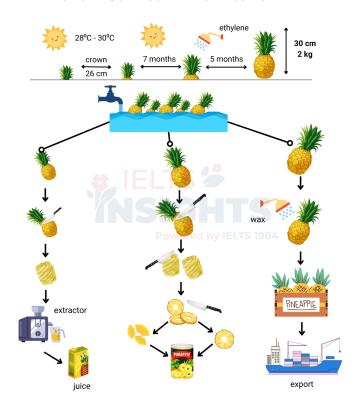
4 Paraphrasing

Bài này chúng mình sẽ lặp rất nhiều lần từ 'pineapple' (Tự nhiên gợi nhớ lại bài hát Pineapple Pen viral ngày xưa). Chúng mình có thể tránh lặp từ pineapple bằng 'the fruit' nhé mọi người, mình xen lẫn 2 từ này trong bài nha.

5 Vocabulary

Lưu ý lớn nhất của dạng Process là các cấu trúc tả thời gian 'sau đó' 'tiếp theo sau', các bạn có thể note thêm những cụm đã được highlight nhé.

The process diagram details the steps by which pineapples are produced for sale. Summarise the information by selecting and reporting the main features, and make comparisons where relevant.

The given process illustrates the cultivation of **pineapples** and how they are processed into various types of products.

Overall, the production of pineapple products involves multiple steps, with the cultivation phase typically requiring around a year, **after which** the fruit can be made into juice, or canned, or exported as whole fruit, depending on its size.

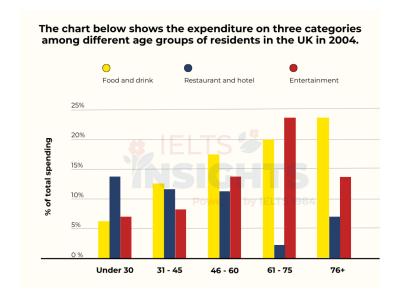
Regarding cultivation, pineapples begin their life cycle from leftover crowns, which are planted around 26 centimeters apart from one another. Sunny weather is crucial, and the ideal temperature for growth is between 28 and 30 degrees Celsius. **After a period of** 7 months, the plants are ready to be sprayed with ethylene, **after which** it needs an additional 5 months to reach maturity, ending up at a height of 30 centimeters and a weight of 2 kilograms.

The harvested fruit is then washed with clean water **before undergoing** one of three distinct processing methods, depending on its size. **In the first one**, for small fruit, initially the crown and skin are removed manually by using knives, **and subsequently** an extractor is used to turn the pineapple flesh into juice. **In the case of medium-sized fruit**, **after following** the same preparatory stage, the pineapples are either sliced or diced, **followed by** canning. **Finally**, the largest fresh fruit is coated with wax and packed into crates, **ready for** distribution to international markets via cargo ships. **(229 words)**

DISCUSSION

Idea cho overview

Đây là **bài Bar Chart** để **tả việc phân bổ ngân sách** vào 3 hạng mục: Food and drink, restaurant and hotel, và entertainment ở 5 nhóm tuổi khác nhau vào năm 2004.

Những số IELTS Insights trước chúng mình đã tìm hiểu về đồ thị theo trend rất nhiều rồi, lần này chúng mình cũng sẽ cùng nhau viết một bài về trend => nhưng rất dễ...sai, vì trend này là theo tuổi tác, chứ không phải theo thời gian như bình thường.

Theo kinh nghiệm chúng mình dạy ở các khóa BLOOM ôn thi ở trung tâm IELTS 1984, học sinh chúng mình thường dùng language sai khá nhiều với dạng này, lý do là các bạn...quen tay và dùng máy móc các cấu trúc của trend thay đổi qua thời gian để tả (ví dụ: increase over given period... => không đúng vì ở đây chỉ trong 1 năm 2004).

Nhìn sơ qua bài này, mình thấy là ở các độ đuổi lớn hơn thì người ta chi nhiều hơn cho Food and Drink, còn Entertainment cũng tăng qua tuổi tác, trừ độ tuổi lớn nhất 76+. Cuối cùng Restaurant and Hotel thì xu hướng ít rõ ràng hơn: giảm nhẹ => giảm mạnh => hồi phục.

Với phần overview bài này, chúng mình gần như chỉ có thể nói về trend chung thôi, chứ còn về so sánh lớn nhất/ nhỏ nhất giữa các hạng mục/nhóm tuổi thì không rõ ràng, nên chúng mình không thêm vào.

TREND: Khi con người già hơn thì **nhìn chung** là họ phân bổ ngân sách lớn hơn cho food and drink và entertainment, còn restaurant and hotel thì đi theo hướng ngược lại.

**Đây là xu hướng chung, overall, mình nhìn tổng thể trend chứ không nhìn vào chi tiết nhé mọi người.

2 Cách phân 2 body

Bài này có **nhiều cách để phân body**, mình có thể phân theo nhóm tuổi (ví dụ body 1 thì gom 3 nhóm tuổi đầu, body 2 là 3 nhóm còn lại), hoặc có thể phân theo hạng mục (dễ nhất là mình phần 3 body, mỗi body là 1 hạng mục khác nhau, viết cho tất cả các nhóm tuổi luôn).

Chúng mình gần như luôn luôn phân theo nhóm tuổi như cách 1 (khi dạy ở IELTS 1984 và khi soạn IELTS Insights những tháng trước). Tuy nhiên, lần này để có sự mới mẻ thì chúng mình sẽ **phân theo hạng mục** nhé mọi người, **mỗi body sẽ tả 1 category cho tất cả nhóm tuổi**. Mình thử viết khác một chút, bài này có **3 body** xem như nào nhé.

3 Cách lần lượt tả từng câu

Phần này các bạn hãy đọc thêm comment của giám khảo ở cuối nhé. Bài này rất đặc biệt là bài gốc của chúng mình viết **bị...trừ điểm Task Achievement**. Lý do vì khi tả trend

=> nếu xu hướng là **tăng đều** thì chúng mình **không cần tả hết mọi thông tin ở giữa** của trend.

Bình thường với dạng line qua thời gian, hiển nhiên chúng mình biết việc đó. Tuy nhiên, đây là dạng thay đổi qua...tuổi, để cẩn thận thì chúng mình tả đủ hết các thay đổi ở giữa, và hệ quả là bị... mất điểm ⁽²⁾. Mọi người lưu ý thêm phần này nhé.

=> Nếu trend tăng/giảm đều như Food and Drink thì chúng mình rất quan trọng ở số liệu đầu & cuối nhé mọi người, còn lại do nó là tăng/giảm đều nên những thông tin ở giữa không quan trọng lắm nha.

Cách lần lượt tả từng câu

Body 1: Tå Food and Drink

(Chỉ có 1 câu) Tả nhóm tuổi nhỏ nhất under-30 chi 6% => sau đó tăng dần qua tuổi => đến nhóm tuổi cao nhất over 76 thì chi 23% ngân sách cho Food and Drink.

Body 2: Tả Restaurants and Hotels Nhóm tuổi nhỏ nhất chi 13% => nhóm 31-45 & 46-60 chi bằng nhau, 12% (gom chung để tả) => nhóm 61-75 chi chỉ có 2%, bằng 1/4 nhóm cao nhất là over 76.

Body 3: Tå Entertainment:

Tả trend chung là phần trăm chi cho Entertainment tăng theo tuổi, từ 7% cho nhóm under 30 đến 23% cho nhóm 61-75. Cuối cùng, mình tách ra một nhóm cuối cùng over 76 là 13%.



Paraphrasing

Bài này chúng mình sẽ rất quan trọng paraphrase độ tuổi nhé mọi người, đây là một chủ điểm ra thi rất nhiều trong Task 1 nên mình phải thông thạo ngôn ngữ phần này. Mình có thể dùng những cách như bên dưới để tả nhóm tuổi, mọi người tham khảo thêm nhé:

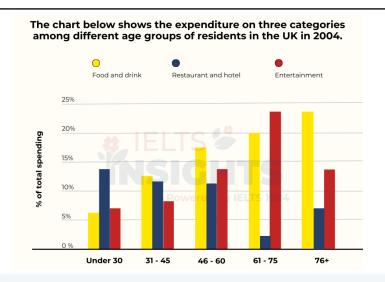

Vocabulary

Lưu ý lớn nhất về vocab trong bài này là các cấu trúc tả trend theo...độ tuổi (tô màu xanh), mọi người để ý thêm nhé. 1. **trend + as people age:** trend như nào đó + khi người ta già đi (age là verb)

- 2. **rise/fall through the age groups:** tăng/giảm qua các nhóm tuổi
- 3. ... rise/fall with age: tăng giảm theo tuổi

The bar chart gives information about how people in five different age groups in the UK spent their budgets on three different categories in 2004.

Overall, people allocated a greater percentage of their budgets to food and drinks and entertainment **as they aged**, while the opposite was the case for restaurants and hotels.

Looking first at spending on food and drinks, **people under 30** spent the least on it, allocating only 6% of their budgets to this category, and **spending on it steadily rose through the age groups**, with the oldest group, **aged over 76**, spending 23% of their money on it.

Restaurants and hotels made up the largest share of the youngest group's budget, at 13%. The 31-45 and **46-60 age brackets** allocated similar proportions to dining out and staying in hotels, both at around 12%. By contrast, **61-to-75-year-olds** spent just 2% on doing so, around a quarter of the figure for those over 76.

Spending for entertainment purposes **rises with age**, except for the oldest group, as spending rose from 7% by the under 30s to 23% spent by the **61-75 age group**. However, **people over 76** spent much less, at only 13% of their total budget. **(199 words)**

DISCUSSION



Idea cho overview

Đây là một bài Table không thể classic hơn, các dữ liệu đơn giản được sắp xếp theo 2 chiều côt ngang & doc*, và dữ liệu thuần tuý thay đổi qua thời gian nên việc mô tả cũng đơn giản. Lưu ý lớn nhất ở bài này là nước Chad đến 2003 mới khai thác dầu, mình cần phải diễn đạt ý này trong overview và body nhé mọi người.

Nếu moi người đã đọc các số trước, chắc đã rất rõ bài Table này chỉ là một bài Line 'trá hình', vậy nên chúng mình tuân theo đúng các kiến thức cũ để viết overview là ổn nha

- 1. Trend chung: Somalia và Chad (dù mới khai thác từ 2003) tăng, Congo giảm và Nigeria thì giảm rồi tăng lai.
- 2. Lớn nhất/nhỏ nhất: Bài này không thể hiện rõ nước lớn nhất/nhỏ nhất ở đây. Tuy nhiên, mình có thể so sánh lớn/nhỏ hơn, có thể nói là Chad và Somalia nhỏ hơn hẳn 2 nước Nigeria và Congo.

*Có nhiều bài rối hơn khi mỗi cột ngang/dọc người ta lại chia thành nhiều phần nhỏ nữa

2 Cách phân 2 body

Do bản chất đây là một bài Line trá hình, nên cũng tương tự như quá trình dạy ở các lớp ôn thi BLOOM lại IELTS 1984, chúng mình khuyên học sinh là để tao sư nhất quán trong bài viết thì mình nên chia body theo Line (ở đây là phân theo nước). Nếu đã phân body theo nước thì rất đơn giản, body 1 mình sẽ tả 2 nước lớn, và body 2 mình sẽ tả 2 nước nhỏ.

Ngoài cách phân body theo nước, mình cũng có thể phân body theo thời gian nhé mọi người, ví dụ như body 1 viết từ năm 2000 đến 2022 cho cả 4 nước, body 2 viết cho 2 năm còn lai.

Khi biên soan, chúng mình chỉ ưu tiên tính 'nhất quán' trong quá trình học để người học và độc giả tối ưu thời gian ôn thi của mình nhất. Mọi người lưu ý là luôn có nhiều cách khác nhau để giải quyết cùng một đề bài nhé.

3 Cách lần lượt tả từng câu

Body 1: Tả 2 nước lớn Congo và Nigeri

(Câu 1) So sánh 2 số liệu năm đầu 2000 của Congo và Nigeria: 275,000 vs. 205,000 => (Câu 2) Tả xu hướng của Congo là giảm đều về mức thấp 203,000 ở năm cuối => (Câu 3) So sánh xu hướng của Nigeria, cũng giảm đến năm 2002, sau đó hồi phục trong 2 năm cuối.

Body 2: Tả 2 nước nhỏ Somalia và Chad, do mãi đến 2003 thì Chad mới sản xuất dầu, nên mình sẽ tả hết Somalia, rồi sau đó mới tả Chad nha.

(Câu 1) Somalia sản xuất 5,000 thùng vào năm 2000, sau đó tăng đều lên 21,000 vào 2003 và tăng manh lên 50,000 vào 2004 => (Câu 2) Chad thì đến 2003 mới sản xuất, sau đó tăng mạnh lên 50,000 vào 2004.

4 Paraphrasing

Bài này chúng mình sẽ lặp rất nhiều lần từ 'sản lượng', đơn giản nhất mình có thể nói là 'the amount of oil produced', hoặc có thể dùng từ production nhé moi người (production ngoài nghĩa là 'sự sản xuất' thì nó còn có nghĩa là 'sản lượng' nữa nha).

Sản xuất dầu mình có thể dùng produce / extract / exploit nhé. Lưu ý từ 'manufacture' là kiểu sản xuất trong nhà máy, sản xuất xe hơi, điện thoại, mình dùng để tả dầu mỏ không hợp lý nhé mọi người.

The table gives information about **the amount of oil (in barrels) produced** by four different African countries between 2000 and 2004.

Overall, **oil production** by the two significantly smaller producers, Somalia and Chad, **exhibited an upward trend**, with the latter only commencing **production** in 2003. In contrast, **Congo saw a decline in** its production, while Nigeria's output began to drop before recovering later.

Regarding the two larger producers, in the first year given, Congo **extracted** 275,000 barrels of oil a day, which was 70,000 barrels greater than Nigeria's output. However, the former nation experienced a continual decrease in its **production** every year, eventually reaching a low point of 203,000 barrels daily in 2004. Meanwhile, after a similar downward trend to 190,000 barrels a day in 2002, Nigeria saw its numbers recover in the last two years, to around 210,000 and 213,000 barrels per day.

Somalia, starting with a mere 5,000 barrels per day in 2000, witnessed a gradual increase in its **output** to 21,000 barrels daily in 2003, followed by a surge of almost 150% to 50,000 barrels daily in 2004. Chad, on the other hand, only began its **oil exploitation** in 2003 with 8,000 barrels a day, but dramatically boosted its **production** to 50,000 barrels a day in the following year. **(223 words)**



Task 2 14/10/2023

In many countries, people like to eat a wider variety of food than can be grown in their local area. As a result, much of the food people eat today has to come from other regions. Do you think the advantages of this development outweigh disadvantages?

DISCUSSION

1 Idea & Cách lập luận

Đề bài cho một sự thật là ngày nay người ta nhập đồ ăn từ nhiều nước khác về (thay vì tự sản xuất), vậy thì **mặt lợi** của việc này **có lớn hơn mặt hai không**?

Topic này rất quen thuộc và đã ra thi nhiều lần trong nhiều năm rồi. Một cách bản năng mình có thể nghĩ đây là xu hướng 'tiêu cực', vì cứ cái gì 'ngoại nhập' vào là xấu, nhưng nghĩ cho kĩ lại nhiều khi nó là tích cực chứ không phải tiêu cực.

Do đề này vô tình trùng khớp với homework ở IELTS 1984, chúng mình thường đọc idea của học sinh cho đề này là 'tiêu cực vì ảnh hưởng an ninh lương thực, lỡ như người ta không xuất khẩu cho mình nữa! 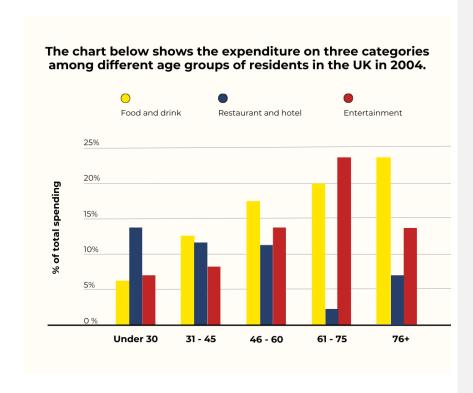
